HABC is sending this letter to provide responses to questions received regarding the subject IFB B-1891-19 Grounds Cleaning Services at Various HABC Developments as follows:

- 1. Q. Is the contractor responsible for the removal of collected trash from the property?
 - A. No. The contractor will place all collected trash in the dumpsters located at the property.
- 2. Q. Is the supervisor considered a worker as defined in the required number of workers per site or as an additional position?
 - A. The workers listed on the Bid Sheet will perform the grounds cleaning work. The contractor is responsible for supervision of the workers listed on the Bid Sheet.
- 3. Q. Are workers required to clean the interior of management offices at the property sites?
 - A. No.
- 4. Q. Is there a specific uniform standard required?
 - A. No. HABC staff and residents must be able to identify each worker as a representative of the contractor. This can be accomplished by the worker wearing a T-Shirt, smock or pullover with the contractors logo on it.
- 5. Q. Is the 4 hours per day a minimum work day per employee provided the worker reports and is On-Time, willing, able and prepared to work?
 - A. Workers are expected to be on-time, willing, and prepared to work the number of hours listed on the bid sheet. Occasionally, workers may be requested to work additional hours due to special events being held at the development. The contractor will be paid for the actual number of hours the workers are on site.

- 1. Provide supervised, uniformed crew, materials and equipment to remove trash, debris, and glass from development site, as directed by the Housing Manager or Maintenance Supervisor. Clean lawns, common areas, playground, parking lots, driveways, walkways, curbs, all common areas, management offices, streets, parking areas and dumpster stations. The work area shall include all exterior areas only.
- 2. The Contractor shall furnish all necessary equipment and materials (gloves, cleaning rags, cleaning chemicals and solutions) to perform the work. All materials furnished by the Contractor shall be non-hazardous.
- 3. The Contractor's workers assigned to each development must sign the daily sign-in and sign-out logs maintained at the Security Monitor Booth or Management office. The Contractor shall not be paid for any worker who fails to sign the daily sign-in and sign-out logs.
- 4. The Contractor will **not be** responsible for removal of bulk trash, potentially hazardous materials, chemical containers and medical waste.
- 5. Assist HABC with spreading salt prior to and during snow events.
- 6. All workers engaged in the work covered under this contract shall be paid in accordance with Attachment 9 Wage Determination No.: 2015-4265, Revision No.: 9, dated 12/26/2018, Occupation Code 11210 Laborer, Grounds Maintenance: \$ 14.14 per hour + Health & Welfare: \$ 4.48 per hour = \$ 18.62 per hour.
- 7. Workers are to be present at each development listed below five (5) days per week, Monday through Friday. All workers shall report to the developments at 8:00 a.m.
