I was born and raised in East Baltimore, just a block or two from Johns Hopkins Hospital. I graduated from Baltimore Polytechnic Institute at the age of 17. One week later I was in boot camp in the US Navy, in pursuit of training to operate nuclear propulsion plants. The training would take the better part of 2 years, then I was sent out to sea. I was attached to the USS Mississippi, a nuclear powered guided missile cruiser.

During my time at sea I volunteered to join a unit comprised of US Navy and US Coast Guard personnel. We boarded maritime vessels searching for contraband during the 1st Gulf War. After the war we hunted drugs in the Caribbean. For my efforts I was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, the Coast Guard Special Operations Service Medal, the Kuwait Liberation Medal, the Southwest Asia Campaign Medal, and several others. I was honorably discharged in 1992 and rejoined the civilian sector.

I returned home to Baltimore and enrolled in Towson University, where I obtained a Bachelor Of Science degree in Chemistry. After spending 15 years working in the chemical and energy sectors, I resigned and launched Aegis Mechanical Corporation. We are now in our 13th year of operation and can regularly be found wherever the action is.
