- Have its headquarters or more than 51% of its physical operations located in an economically-distressed area OR have more than 40% of employees residing in an economically-distressed area.
- Be past the proof-of-concept stage.
- Have been in operation for two years or more. ICCC does not accept start-up companies.

The culminating conference centers on building strategies of resilience and connecting with capital providers. Participants exit the program with the tools to access immediate capital solutions, a vibrant network, and an effective strategy for their business to lead, survive, and thrive.



The ICCC program begins with an interactive virtual two-day seminar series that focuses on actionable business recovery strategies, and offers essential information on capital resources available. The sessions are taught by top-flight business professors, and lay the foundation for the rest of the program.





Participants receive one-on-one general business and capital coaching and receive individualized guidance to help their businesses survive and recover. Coaching helps business owners tackle specific challenges, navigate uncertainty, and access much-needed capital.



The webinar series deepens the learning from the Opening Seminar, and offers timely and relevant information to help participants overcome immediate challenges. Webinars are led by experienced practitioners who deliver applicable resources that participants can easily implement in their business.
